



#### Can You Identify this Person?



??? person arrived in Spokane in 1905 and soon became active in the Hillyard Christian Church then located on Lacey St between Queen Ave and Wabash Ave. ??? had been on the lookout for a farm and always ended up in the foothills region of Hillyard.

Southeast of the Great Northern Railway yards in Hillyard, a dirt country road wounded up into these foothills. In

the spring of the year, they became alive with flowers and green tufts of grass amid the scrub

pine. You could look back over the valley below and view the buildings of Hillyard and Spokane. As one reached the top of the hill, the road lead through a saddle behind what later became known as Beacon Hill (overlooking Felts Field). The road traveled up another grade and then made a sharp left turn, there ??? found a 40-acre piece of property. This property is on Valley Spring Road on the corner where it turns north towards Bigelow Gulch Road.





Old records showed that a trail wound through the area that was used earlier by Indians in traveling from the Spokane River below the Bigelow Gulch and farther north to Pleasant Prairie. In the 1870's, Spokane Chief Gary, famed Indian leader had lived on a small farm just over the hill towards Hillyard.

About that time, some false accusations were made against him by a couple of Elders in his Church. He decided to retaliate by going nearly naked to attract the issue into the open. He soon found that his general health greatly improved, so for the balance of his life he only wore a pair of shorts, summer and winter, no matter the weather. This attire was usually augmented by a sunshade on his head. He was soon dubbed "Spokane's Nature Boy".

In the 1920's, he lost his ranch in a fraudulent deal, so spent years trying to get the property back, resulting in court appearances and jail terms plus countless news accounts and photos. In time, the publicity helped make his name a household word in the Inland Empire. Soon, he supported himself by selling picture postcards of himself at picnics, fairs, and events in the Northwest. Later, he traveled to the Chicago World's Fair and in time, traveled

throughout the United States where he became known as "Spokane's Ambassador of Goodwill".

During World War Two, he helped build Farragut Naval Training Station near Sandpoint, Idaho while dressed in his usual attire (sun-tan shorts) plus a carpenter's apron.

On May 12, 1956, he was killed in an auto crash while rounding a curve on North Hamilton at Cleveland. His funeral was Spokane's largest.





Bike registration and helmet safety rules are


provided. They are being planned for the summer. Times and dates will be posted at a later date.

#### **Interesting Comments From the Readers**

#### Facts from ......Charles Hansen

Ushers Store was located at 601 1/2 Market in Hillyard according to the 1911 City Directory of Spokane. Since Hillyard numbered streets from South Avenue (Wellesley today) that means Ushers Store was on Diamond and Market. Note Like Spokane they did not use N for addresses north of South Avenue, just as Spokane did not use N for addresses north of Sprague in 1911.

#### Mrs. V. Taylor's Yester-Years.....

My dad used to work for the original "Kaiser" and was one of the first 200 hired. They used to have a special dinner for those first 200 workers. So Hillyard was the place to shop for everything.

I remember going to Hillyard as a young girl, my sister and I would drool in the bakery window. We always wanted something sweet from the bakery but our mother always made all of our baked goods at home. They always looked so good.

My mom would buy material at the variety store to make us dresses for school and church. I remember window shopping at a fancy shop called Black's & Gold's Clothery.

Thanks for bringing back some memories from when I was a young girl.


#### **Night Life in Hillyard**
